The sold-out event raised over \$11,000. "That's when we knew that we were not the only kids who wanted to do more for our community." The girls were ready to take their ideas to the next level.


Through fundraising, Mary-Brent and Beverly were learning valuable business skills, such as creating a budget and a business plan, filing a 501(c)(3) application and registering their business name as a federal trademark. These were skills they wanted to share. "We wanted to



give other kids the opportunity to combine business and

philanthropy, so we started the Lemonade Brigade," says Beverly. "Our Lemonade Brigade Workshops teach kids business skills such as fiscal responsibility and marketing and also things such as not chewing gum or texting while working."

"At our workshops, Beverly and I give a talk about responsible giving. We do a lot of research before we decide which non-profits will receive the money we raise. We want the kids to know that they can do this, too," says Mary-Brent.



With an annual budget of over \$30,000 and total giving at the \$100,000 mark, Kids Wanna Help is proof that a young age is no barrier to success in the serious business of philanthropy.
